

Committee Activities:

Workshops are organized every two years, the results of which are published in Phytopathologia Mediterranea. A strong network was created since the very beginning that brings to create a close network of communication and collaboration. Students and researchers moved from one research centre to the other for collaboration in research and for exchange of information. The frequent and most friendly contacts created a really fruitful and pleasant friendly atmosphere in the group. In this atmosphere ICGTD

Workshops also became an occasion for discussion and decision making on general matters as names of the trunk diseases we are dealing with.

A proposal for a European research project within the H2020 frame is under evaluation which involves collaborations with ICGTD members also out of Europe.

Subject Matter Committee focus issues:

The ICGTD is a non-profit organisation. It has no sponsors, no membership fees. All its activities are carried out on a volunteer basis and has the strong support of ISPP and of MPU (Mediterranean Phytopathological Society, editor of Phytopathologia Mediterranea).

Tasks and delimitation of activities. Grapevine fungal trunk diseases, whose agents are located in the mature stem (trunk and cordons) of grapevines, with special emphasis on Esca and related diseases, but also including trunk diseases caused by other fungal pathogens such as Eutypa, Botryosphaeria, black foot agents, Diaporthe and so on.

Publications

The abstracts of the papers presented at each meeting are always published in Phytopathologia Mediterranea soon after the workshop. Selected and peerly reviewed Review papers and Research papers are then published as Special issues containing some of the more relevant results obtained on the subject that had been presented by selected experts at the workshops. The Special issues (9 up to now and the 10th will be published in August 2018) were published in *Phytopathologia Mediterranea* (www.fupress.com/pm). Some of these issues were published also thanks to the relevant support of ISPP (Special issue of Phytopathologia Mediterranea on grapevine trunk diseases, namely the 3rd and the 7th Special issue).

Additional Comments

The links created within the ICGTD were the base for the construction of the European network on the subject. Therefore in the last three years the ICGTD collaborated quite closely with the COST Action ManaGTD – FA1303 Sustainable control of Grapevine Trunk Diseases, under the guidance of Dr Florence Fontaine. The collaboration led to organizing the last ICGTD workshop, held in Reims, France, jointly with the COST Action FA1303. This gave a very successful meeting, under the lead of Pr Florence Fontaine, who then was elected Chairperson of the Council for the next term.
