The Indian Phytopathological Society (IPS) is a professional forum for promoting the cause of science of Phytopathology. It is the second largest society of plant pathologists in the world. The Society is an international scientific organization devoted to the study of plant diseases and their control. Society advances modern concepts in plant health management in agricultural, urban and forest settings. Society provides information on the latest developments and research advances in plant health science through its journals and participates in the exchange of plant health information with public policy makers, and the larger scientific community; and provides opportunities for scientific communication, collaboration, and professional development.

The Society focuses on the field of Mycology, Fungal Pathology, Bacteriology, Virology and Nematology. It provides a forum to the scientists to interact on important issues of Plant Pathological research, education and extension. The society organizes National and International conferences, symposia and seminars on major topics of Plant Pathology. Its nearly more than 2,000 members are located in more than 50 countries. They are research scientists, teachers, extension professionals, students, private consultants, administrators, technicians, agricultural field representatives, and pest management personnel. Their professions vary, but they have one common goal – to promote knowledge of plant disease and their control.

The Society has eight Zonal Chapters and each one having its Zonal President and Councillor elected every year. All the Zonal Chapters are actively associated with the scientific activities of their zone.

The Society regularly honors individuals who have made significant contributions to the science of plant pathology through several prestigious awards presented at the Annual Meeting every year. The Society has instituted many awards named after distinguished agricultural scientists and plant pathologists of India namely, Mundkur Memorial Lecture, S.P. Raychaudhrui Memorial Lecture, M.S. Pavgi Lecture, Jeersanidhi Lecture, S.N. Dasgupta Lecture Awards, A.P. Misra Lifetime Achievement Award, M.K. Patel Memorial Young

Scientist Award, J.F. Dastur Memorial Award, J.P. Verma Memorial, A.K. Sarbhoy Memorial Award, Sharda Lele Memorial Award, D.P. Misra & R.N. Pandey - IPS Best Women Scientist Award and B.N. Chakraborty and Usha Chakraborty - IPS Best Teacher Award, to recognize excellence in agricultural and allied sciences including environment and nutrition. These awards are presented in the Annual Meeting of the Society annually and biannually.

"Prof. M.J. Narsimhan Merit Academic Award Contest" is organized by the Society every year to honour its young and budding scientists to encourage them and inculcate the feeling of competitiveness. The Society provides travel sponsorship "IPS Travels Sponsorship for Ph.D. Students" to 8 Ph.D. students to promote their participation in Annual Meeting and National Symposium of the Society in India. The competition for "APS Travel Sponsorship for Ph.D. Students" is also organized during Annual Meeting and National Symposium of the Society. The purpose of this award is to encourage plant pathology students pursuing a doctoral degree in India, who are members of IPS, to attend the APS Annual Meeting or other APS sanctioned meeting.

The society also honours its members by judging their best research papers published in the journal every year by awarding "Prof. M.J. Narasimhan Medal Best Research Paper".

The Annual Meeting is the Society's premier event, attracting some 400-500 participants a year. The latest advances approaches in the field of plant pathology are presented and attendees have the opportunity to participate in symposia and discussion sessions, view hundreds of technical posters, present research results, attend special events, learn about new products and services, and connect with others who share their interests. National Symposium gives members the opportunity to meet with colleagues to exchange ideas, and share information. The Society is pioneer in organizing International Symposia in field of Plant Pathology. So far, six International Conferences have been organized.

The Society organizes regular symposia to discuss plant pathological problems of zonal/regional importance as well as workshops, lectures, etc., by eminent plant pathologists from within the country and abroad throughout the country through its Zonal Chapters. Plant pathology in the Region Served by the Society 2013-2018

1. The Society uses the journal and the conference/meetings as a way to stimulate and create contacts and spreading of information on research carried out in the area. The Society has highlighted the issues of focus and achievements in the plant pathology throughout the country by organizing zonal symposiums annually in different parts/region of India during 2008-2013 on different emerging topics and so far from 2013 to 2018, the Society has organized 35 zonal symposia (http://ipsdis.org/past-zonal-symposia).

International Collaborations

- APS-IPS Collaborations memorandum of understanding between the American Phytopathological Society (APS) and the Indian Phytopathological Society (IPS) was signed during 6th International Conference to facilitate mutually beneficial interactions through scientific exchanges and increased sharing of science by joint memberships and professional interactions.
- APS-IPS Travel grant to IPS student members for participation in APS Meeting in USA: PS Travel Sponsorship for Students has been instituted. The purpose of this award is to encourage plant pathology students pursuing a doctoral degree in India, who are members of IPS, to attend the APS Annual Meeting or other APS sanctioned meeting if deemed appropriate by the Indian Phytopathology Society and APS Foundation Board.
- Agreement has been signed with Springer (India) Private Ltd., New Delhi for co-publication of the Journal Indian Phytopathology from January 2018 (Vol. 71, Issue 01, 2018) onwards initially for five years (2018-2022).
